Why Privacy is Important

Are You Willing to Give Up Your Rights?

- I don't think I'm scared that Facebook/Google has my personal information.
- Your rights matter because you never know when you are going to need them.
- Will someone in the future use these things against you.

Why Privacy is Important

We Have a **RIGHT** to Privacy

Not everyone shares this view!



But there are **OTHER** people who care
about your information

...and use it for their benefit

- Government
- Private Corporations (Facebook/Google)
- Nefarious Actors (Foreign countries, Criminals)

What Happened to My Internet???

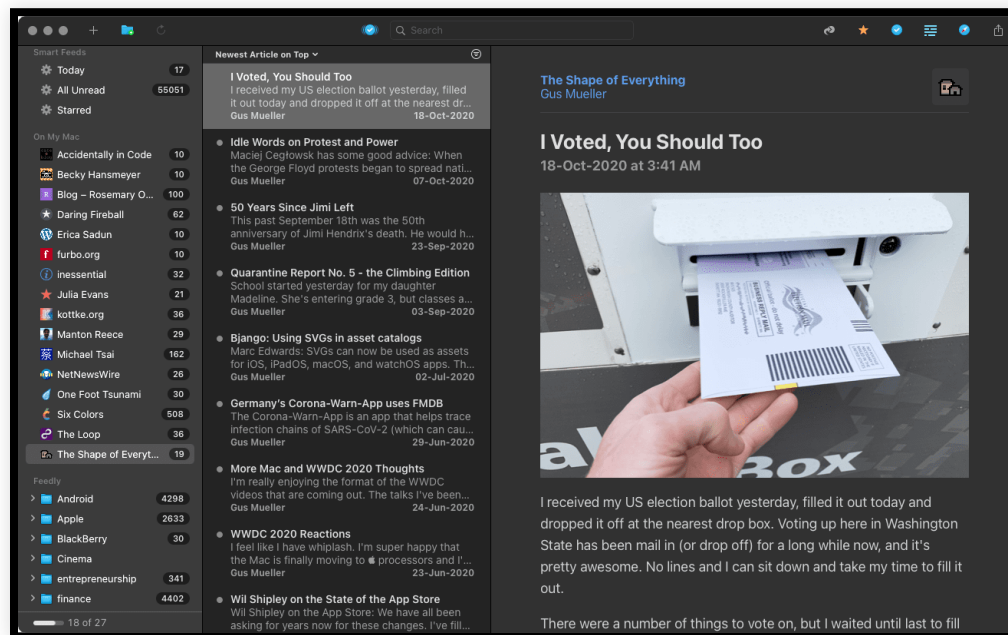
Not a free Internet

Walled Gardens

- Facebook Posts
- Facebook Messenger
- Reddit/Twitter (news, etc)

Bring Back Decentralization

- Start using content driven Websites for your content.
- Remember www and RSS?
- This content can be aggregated into a feed or news reader.



Steps You Can Take to Help Protect Your Families Privacy

- Home Network (Wifi, ISP)
- Desktop (Browser/Email/Messenger)
- Mobile (GPS/Apps, etc)

- Firewall/Router
 - Untangle (<https://untangle.com>)
 - Firewalla (<https://firewalla.com>)
 - pfSense (Do-it-yourself) (<https://pfsense.org>)

Home Network

- VPN (virtual private network)
 - Express VPN
 - ProtonVPN

Home Network

- DNS settings
 - Cloudflare DNS (<https://cloudflare.com>)
 - PiHole (<https://pi-hole.net>)

 - Privacy.com

- Cover your CAMERA!

Desktop

Browser

- Stop using Chrome!
 - Use Brave (or Firefox with Privacy Badger)

Desktop

Browser

- Use Secure Passwords (Password Manager)
 - Bitwarden

Desktop

Browser

- Browser's Private Mode?
 - Worthless

Desktop

Browser

- Use SSL site encryption everywhere
 - Plugin HTTPS Everywhere
- Stop using Google Search
 - Use duckduckgo.com (or other privacy centered search engines)



Desktop

Email

- Use a paid for email service (slowly migrate from Gmail, etc)
 - FastMail (fastmail.com)
 - ProtonMail ([Protonmail.com](https://protonmail.com))
- Sensitive emails - send encrypted using GPG (Gnu Privacy Gaurd)
 - ProtonMail has built in GPG support

Desktop

Messaging

- Dump WhatsApp or Facebook Messenger
- Use Signal (signal.org)

Mobile Privacy

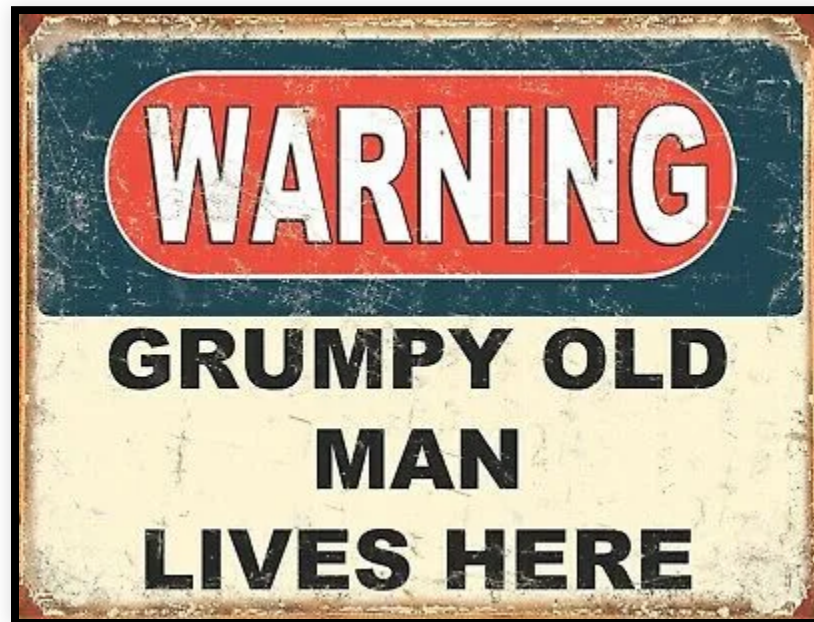
Mobile

- Block cameras if possible.
- VPN on your phone
- Signal app for your messaging

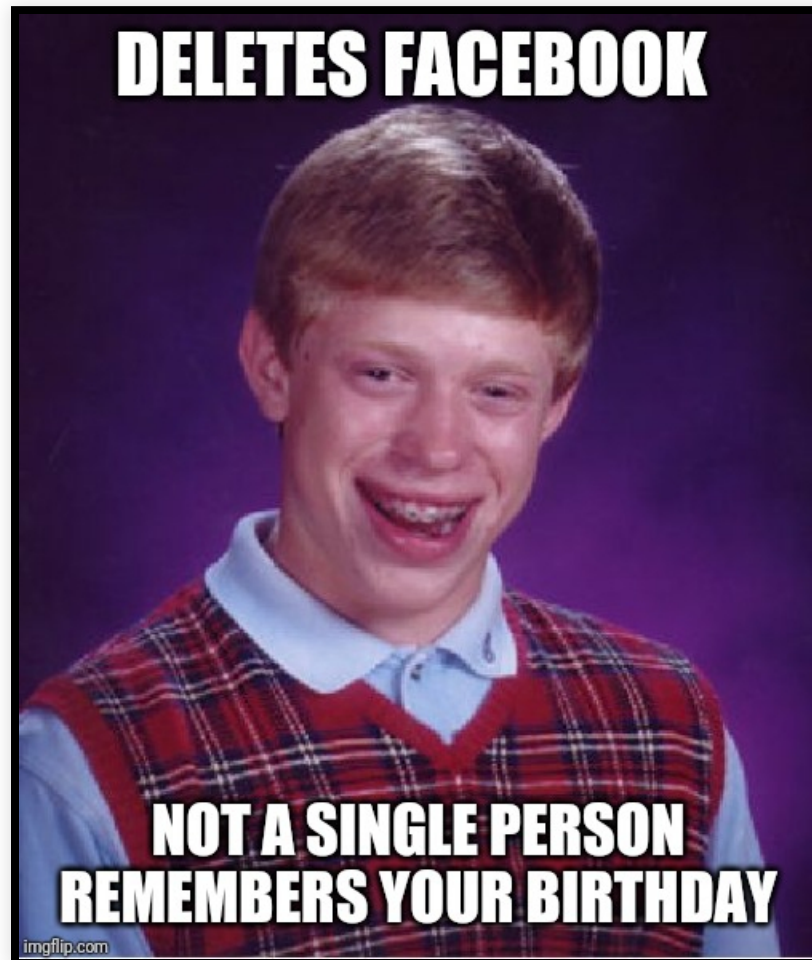

Suggestions

- Think before you post
 - Who else might see this outside my "friends"
 - What possible identifying information might I be giving people.
 - Use websites and RSS feeds for your news.
- Limit your childrens exposure
 - Time limits (on screen time)
 - App restrictions
 - No on mobile apps
