TEEN CONFERENCE

How do we know there really is a God?

According to a Gallup poll published in 2023 (Belief in Five Spiritual Entities Edges Down to New Lows) belief in God among Americans has dropped from 90% in 2001 to 74% in 2023. Among those ages 18-34 only 59% believe in God. Now more than ever it's important for us to **"always be ready to give a defense to anyone who asks you for a reason for the hope that is in you"** (1 Peter 3:15). In this conference students will learn good reasons and evidence to believe that God really does exist. For example, they'll learn about First Cause, Design, and Moral arguments for God (Romans 1:19-20, 2:14-15). We'll also cover the best responses to arguments against God such as the Problem of Evil and the Problem of Divine Hiddenness. They'll also have the opportunity to practice sharing their faith through role playing.

Parents of the young entrepreneurs must be registered for the Parenting and Homeschool Conference. Children and teens participating in the Kids or Teen Conferences are eligible to participate in the Maker's Market.

Each vendor will be required to man their booth independently (parental supervision is encouraged for younger entrepreneurs)

Each vendor is required to provide their own payment system such as Venmo, Square, or cash (please note the Conference will not have the ability to "make change").
